The One Voice Festival of Singing is a year-round educational partnership programme between Create Music, the Hub Lead Organisation for the Sussex Music Hub and Glyndebourne, supported by De La Warr Pavilion. One Voice gives thousands of local school children the chance to learn to sing and perform together on stage with the Glyndebourne Chorus, members of its orchestra the Glyndebourne Sinfonia and Create Music musicians.

This year, more children than ever will take part, with over 2,500 children from 90 schools performing live in special festive concerts at venues across Sussex including the Brighton Centre, De La Warr Pavilion, Glyndebourne and Kings Centre.

Ashley Beauchamp

Conductor

British pianist and conductor Ashley Beauchamp studied on the opera course of the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. He has worked on over 30 productions with companies including the Royal Opera House, Glyndebourne, Garsington, Waterperry, Nevill Holt and Blackheath Halls Opera. He is Head of Music and Co-Director of the Young Artist Programme at Waterperry Opera Festival, Musical Director of the Glyndebourne Youth Opera, and Musical Director of Thames Opera Company. He was previously Head of Music for Nevill Holt Opera.



Upcoming highlights include returning to Glyndebourne for much of the 2024/25 season - as assistant conductor on their Autumn 2024 revival of *La Traviata*, conducting their "One Voice Festival of Singing" Christmas Concerts 2024, working as assistant conductor and chorus master for the world-premiere of Jonathan Dove's new opera *Uprising* in Spring 2025, and as assistant conductor for their revival of *Il barbiere di Siviglia* for the Festival 2025.

Ashley is a passionate advocate for musical education and participation and every year introduces thousands of people across the UK to singing and performing opera for the first time. He has a longstanding relationship with the education departments of both the Royal Opera House and Glyndebourne, has worked as a staff pianist for the Royal College of Music, and as a musical director for opera scenes at the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire and Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance. Ashley was born in London, but grew up in Sussex and has family all across the South. He was a proud member of the Brighton and Hove Music Service growing up, and was a member of the Brighton Youth Orchestra and the Brighton & Hove Big Band for many years.

Mel Scott

Assistant Conductor

Mel Scott is a qualified teacher and primary music specialist with over 15 years' experience. She has led and developed music and arts in schools and their communities and has worked with choirs and instrument groups for children from early years to teenage. She also conducted massed children's choirs at the Assembly Hall Theatre in Tunbridge Wells.

Mel is a trained singer, having studied with professional tenor and teacher, James Anderson. She worked as a professional actor and singer, including in London Fringe and touring in theatre in education, and has sung with a number of choirs, as choir member and soloist, working with a range of professional conductors.



In 2022, Mel joined Create Music and is now their Music Curriculum Lead Teacher, working with children and teachers across Brighton & Hove and East Sussex.

Jade Moffat

Mezzo-Soprano, Glyndebourne

Born in Queensland, Australia, mezzo-soprano Jade Moffat is a recent graduate of the Guildhall School of Music and Drama's Opera Course. Jade is an Independent Opera Fellow, a Samling Artist, a Tait Scholar, and was a young artist with Opera Queensland and Garsington. She was the proud recipient of the Wessex Glyndebourne Award for 2019, recently won the IFAC Australian Singing Competition, and was the recipient of the Nora Goodridge Developing Artist Award with the Australian Music Foundation. In 2023 Jade joined Glyndebourne Festival Opera, where she performed the role of Soeur Mathilde in *Dialogues* des Carmélites and covered Mother Goose in The Rake's Progress. Jade was thrilled to join Glyndebourne again for their 2024 seasons, where she covered the role of Mercédès in Carmen, Flora in La Traviata, as well as being a soloist for their Pit Perfect scheme concerts. Recent operatic engagements include: Ježibaba/Rusalka for Garsington, Countess Ceprano/Rigoletto for Glyndebourne Touring Opera, cover Filipyevna/Eugene Onegin for Garsington Festival Opera, Soloist/Opera Highlights Tour for Scottish Opera, Marcellina/Le nozze di Figaro for Clonter Opera, cover Cornelia/Giulio Cesare for Bury Court Opera, Judith/Bluebeards Castle for Cambridge Philharmonic, cover Kate Pinkerton/Madama Butterfly for Opera Australia, Zenobia/Radamisto, Mother/Mavra, and Marta/Iolanta for GSMD, Diane/The Perfect American for Opera Queensland, Fenena/Nabucco for IFAC Tokyo. On the concert platform Jade has been a soloist for many key works.
