Get on board! One Voice 2025 takes us on a fantastic musical journey of song, crossing centuries, seas and cultures

The One Voice Festival of Singing is a year-round educational partnership programme between Create Music, the Hub Lead Organisation for the Sussex Music Hub, and Glyndebourne, supported by De La Warr Pavilion. One Voice gives thousands of local school children the chance to learn to sing and perform together on stage with the Glyndebourne Chorus, Glyndebourne Sinfonia and Create Music musicians.

One Voice 2025 will see more than 2,400 children from over 80 schools, take part in 11 concerts across the region, performing at one of three leading iconic arts venues on the South Coast: Glyndebourne, De La Warr Pavilion and, for the first time this year, Brighton Dome.

Ashley Beauchamp Conductor



British conductor and pianist Ashley Beauchamp studied at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. He has worked on over 30 productions for companies including the Royal Opera House, Glyndebourne, Garsington, Nevill Holt, Music Theatre Wales and Blackheath Halls. He is Head of Music and Co-Director of the Young Artist Programme at Waterperry Opera Festival, Music Director of the Glyndebourne Youth Opera and Music Director of the Thames Opera Company. Hugely passionate about music education and participation, Ashley regularly runs workshops and projects across the UK, introducing thousands of people of all ages and backgrounds to opera every year.

Ashley returns to Glyndebourne for much of the 2025/26 season - as assistant conductor for two world-premieres by Jonathan Dove and Mark-Anthony Turnage, and as assistant conductor for *II barbiere di Siviglia* (Rossini). 2026 sees Ashley conducting the world-premiere of

a new opera by Charlotte Marlow for Jersey Opera House, returning to Garsington Opera as assistant conductor for *The Importance of Being Earnest* (Barry) and as Musical Director for their 2026 OperaFirst programme. In Autumn 2026, Ashley will conduct the world-premiere of *Spark*, a new youth opera by Lucy Armstrong. Other highlights include returning as Guest Coach at the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire and performances and an album recording with internationally- renowned flautist Stephen Clark.

Ashley was born in London, but grew up in Sussex and has family all across the South. He was a proud member of the Brighton and Hove Music Service growing up, and was a member of the Brighton Youth Orchestra and the Brighton & Hove Big Band for many years.

Mel Scott
Assistant Conductor



Mel Scott is a qualified teacher and primary music specialist with over 18 years' experience. She has led and developed music and arts in schools and their communities and has worked with choirs and instrument groups for children from early years to teenage. She has also conducted massed children's choirs at the Assembly Hall Theatre in Tunbridge Wells.

Mel is a trained singer, having studied with professional tenor and teacher, James Anderson. She has worked as a professional actor and singer, including in London Fringe and theatre in education tours, and has sung with a number of choirs, as choir member and soloist, working with a range of professional conductors.

In 2022, Mel joined Create Music and is now their Music Curriculum Lead Teacher, working with children and teachers across Brighton & Hove and East Sussex.

Melissa Gregory Mezzo-Soprano, Glyndebourne



Australian mezzo-soprano Melissa Gregory is a graduate of the Royal Northern College of Music and the Queensland Conservatorium. She was a Welsh National Opera Associate Artist for the 2023/24 season and is currently based in the UK. Melissa was awarded the Lady Fairfax La Scala Opera Award in 2024, spending part of the 2024/25 season at La Scala, Milan, covering Meg Page Falstaff and Olga Eugene Onegin.

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Melissa returned to Glyndebourne Festival Opera in 2025, covering Varvara Kát'ya Kabanová and Zweites Blümenmädchen Parsifal. She previously sang Praskowia The Merry Widow in the 2024 Festival and covered Zaida II turco in Italia for the autumn tour. She also performed Soeur St Charles in Dialogues des Carmélites and has covered Dorabella Così fan tutte and Margarita Xirgu Ainadamar for Welsh National Opera.

Upcoming engagements include Dorabella Così fan tutte for Opera Project and the title role in La Cenerentola for Diva Opera's tour to South Africa and Scotland. Melissa was awarded 3rd Prize in the

2024 Joan Sutherland and Richard Bonynge Bel Canto Awards, and previously won the Bampton Classical Opera Young Singer of the Year and the inaugural London Choral Sinfonia Leach Award. She is also a Samling Artist.

Melissa's concert work includes a London Handel Festival Finalists Recital at the Charterhouse, and mezzo-soprano solos in the Verdi *Requiem*, Beethoven's 9th Symphony, Bach's Magnificat, and Mozart's *Requiem*, broadcast in Australia and internationally.

Create Music is part of Brighton Dome & Brighton Festival, and the Hub Lead Organisation for the Sussex Music Hub.
